Building Bridges of Understanding

Over the past four years pupils have been engaging in the Building Bridges of Understanding Programme. This is an English programme used to help improve comprehension and reading skills in our pupils. Children learn strategies to help improve their reading, like learning to use prediction, visualisation, making connections to prior knowledge and "declunking" or breaking up words. This programme is currently running in some classrooms for the next few weeks. This is a good time to encourage your children to join the library and get them into the habit of reading library books. We are gradually moving away from the idea of having class readers and encouraging children to read novels and "real books" at their own individual levels and abilities. Parental support is hugely important in this area.

Book Rental Scheme has worked very successfully for the past two years and we will be continuing it again this year. For the past two years we have received a grant to help get the scheme up and running and to purchase the huge number of books required for 126 pupils! However there will be no grant from now on and we will have to make some adjustments. It is still hoped to be able to supply children with all their books, copies and workbooks but extras like the Christmas annual and extra folders etc will have to be purchased by parents in order to keep the cost at the very good price of €45 per pupil. Agreement forms for parents to sign up to the scheme will be sent out before the end of May.

SPLASH & DASH...Five girls from 5th & 6th class took part in a duathlon on **Monday 25th April** in Rockwell College run by the Tipperary Sports Partnership. The girls had to swim 50 metres, followed immediately by a 600m run.
