



#### **BOOK RENTAL SCHEME**

Early in 2014 all schools who didn't have a Book Rental Scheme in place were contacted by the Department of Education and Skills and asked to set one up in their school and were offered a grant to help do so.

As we currently don't have a Book rental Scheme it would be foolish of us not to claim the grant available to help set up such a scheme in our school. So it is planned to introduce a Book Rental Scheme with effect from next September with the help of the Parents' Council.

Details of how this scheme will run will have to be ironed out and the fee which will have to be paid next June is yet to be set.

However the good news for parents is that next year

- your child/children's books will cost less
- you won't have to shop for or cover your child/children's books

For the scheme to work to the maximum benefit to all everyone has to participate and we will be asking for parents to donate some of their children's old books which are currently still in use.

Full details about the introduction of the book rental scheme will be distributed to parents as soon as the finer details are sorted.

World Book Day takes place on **Thursday 6th March** and children will receive a voucher for €1 off a book. This may be used at the Book Fair!


#### PARENT/TEACHER MEETINGS...
