1st Class

Jollyphonics 1st Class

> p. 40 Jollygrammar 1

Sound: 'ee' sound but 'ea' spelling

- Ask your child what sound 'ea' makes.
- Make a list of words that have this spelling and make this sound, e.g. pea, steal, meat etc.
- Listen to your child reading the words in the orange box on p. 40.
- Circle the words that have 'ea' spelling.
- Your child must now pick from the list of words they made and write 1 into each teapot.
- For the dictation part on the 2nd half of the page, you must call out the words and sentences to your child to write. Correct after with your child.
- The dictation words and sentences: 1.sea, 2.peas, 3.meat, 4.clean, 5.leaf, 6.teapot, 7.My room is neat and clean., 8.She took the dog to the beach., 9.He has peas in his garden.

Sound: 'ie' sound but 'igh' spelling

- Ask your child what sound 'igh' makes.
- Make a list of words that have this spelling and make this sound, e.g. light, fright, night etc.
- Listen to your child reading the words in the green box on p. 42.
- Circle the words that have 'igh' spelling.

- Your child must now pick words from the list they made and write 1 into each lightbulb.
- For the dictation part on the 2nd half of the page, you must call out the words and sentences to your child to write. Correct after with your child.
- The dictation words and sentences: 1.high, 2.sigh, 3.thigh, 4.sight, 5.bright, 6.flight, 7.It was a dark night., 8.My Dad had a fright., 9.There was a bright light.

> p.40 Jollygrammar 2

Sound: 'oi'

- The sound is 'oi' but it can be spelled 'oi' or 'oy'.
- Ask your child what sound 'oi' makes.
- Make a list of words that have the 'oi' and 'oy' spelling and make the 'oi' sound, e.g. oil, boy, ahoy etc.
- Fill in the missing letters in the words in the grey box on p.40 and listen to your child reading them.
- Complete p40.
- Tell your child to go to the back of the book for dictation(they know where).
- You must call out the words and sentences to your child to write. Correct after with your child.
- Remind your child that they will all have 1 of the 2 spellings in them ('oi' and 'oy')
- The dictation words and sentences: 1.oil, 2.joint, 3.coin, 4.annoy, 5.boy, 6.toilet, 7.The weather was boiling hot., 8.My sister destroyed her toy clock.
- > p.42 Jollygrammar 2

Sound: 'ou'

- The sound is 'er' but it can be spelled 'ou' or 'ow'.
- It doesn't matter which of these 2 spellings is used in a word, they both make the same sound 'ou'.
- Ask your child what sound 'ou' makes.
- Make a list of words that have the 'ou' and 'uw' spelling and make the 'ou' sound, e.g. out, owl, flower, etc.
- Fill in the missing letters in the words in the pink box on p.42 and listen to your child reading them.
- Complete p.42.

- Tell your child to go to the back of the book for dictation(they know where).
- You must call out the words and sentences to your child to write. Correct after with your child.
- Remind your child that they will all have 1 of the 2 spellings in them ('ou' and 'ow')
- The dictation words and sentences: 1.out, 2.clown, 3.owl, 4.mouse, 5.mouth, 6.flower, 7.I saw a pair of little owls., 8.He rescued the brown mouse.

Time

- Your child will need a clock. Call out o'clock/half past times to your child and they need to show them to you on the clock.
- It is very important that for half past, the small hand is not on a number, it is between 2 numbers. For example, for half past 7, the small hand will be between 7 and 8.
- Tell your child that the only time the small hand is directly on the number is for o'clock.
- For half past, your child might get confused where to put the small hand. I always tell them that the clue is in the time half <u>past 7</u> the small hand is <u>past 7</u>.
- Read and complete p.114.

Time

- For this page, use the clock for each question.
- If it is asking how long it is from 2 o' clock to half past 2, show your child how to use the clock to get the answer.
- This page can be tricky so it's important to complete each question with your child, talking it through and using the clock to demonstrate how to get the answer.

Time - quarter past

- Ask your child if they know where the big hand goes for quarter past.
- Call out quarter past times which your child must show you on a clock.
- It is very important that the small hand is not on the number, it is
 a little past the number. It is not as far past the number as it is
 for half past.
